

How to Upload a PDF Into a Video

Overview

This article explains how to upload a PDF to a Panopto video. Viewers will be able to access the PDF(s) in the video player as a secondary stream. *Please note: PDF uploads are currently limited to 100 MB. Additionally, PDF(s) will appear in the embedded viewer at the beginning of the video. Viewers will need to select **Close** in the upper right corner to proceed with watching the video.*

Prerequisites

- Creator access to Panopto

1. Upload a PDF

1.1. Navigate to the folder that your session is located in. Once you are in the folder, you will see all recorded sessions. Locate the session you would like to upload a PDF to, click on the recorded session and click **Settings** (Fig. 1).

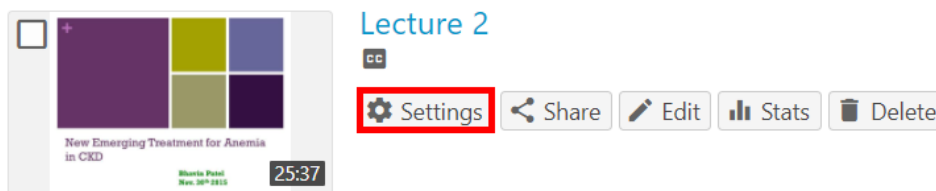

1.2. Once in **Settings**, select the **Streams** tab from the left-hand navigation. At the bottom of the menu, click **Choose File** and select the PDF you would like to upload (Fig. 2). *Note: PDF uploads are currently limited to 100 MB.*
